Just thinking . .

Jesus Indulges Us

God is both merciful and just.

That fact should bring both smile and frown.

We have a chance at heaven if the good Lord can overlook our miscreant behavior. But then we acknowledge that a just God cannot merely look the other way. Our bad behavior, whatever its nature, must be accounted for at judgment time.

Catholic theologians teach that particular judgment happens at the instant of death with the measure of the soul. Upon Christ's second coming – the end of the world – the Last Judgment occurs. "Then will the conduct of each one and the secrets of hearts be brought to light," says the Catechism of the Catholic Church, quoting Scripture. "Then will the culpable unbelief that counted the offer of God's grace as nothing be condemned." Justice is rendered.

And, mercy? Are justice and mercy compatible?

God's mercy is for the living. "As a gift to humanity," St. Pope John Paul II wrote in an encyclical, "the Risen Lord offers his love that pardons, reconciles, and reopens hearts to love. It is a love that converts hearts and gives peace. How much the world needs to understand and accept Divine Mercy!"

Eight days after Easter is the Feast of Divine Mercy. St. Pope John Paul expanded it from Poland and Vatican City to the Universal Church the day he canonized St. Faustina (Helen) Kowalska on April 30, 2000.

This Polish nun, who died in 1938, told in her diary of having Jesus himself setting a feast on that day each year.

Jesus' revelation to her began February 22, 1931, with a vision of mercy radiating from his heart. That image was converted to a picture that has become the symbol of the mercy of the Lord.

This quotation from that diary (cited by EWTN) tenders a divine gift.

On one occasion, I heard these words: My daughter, tell the whole world about My Inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy.

Jesus himself set that day for receiving a plenary indulgence. Again, his words from St. Faustina's diary.

Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.

WANDA LOUISE QUINN

August 18, 1939 — March 18, 2018
