As I write this (August 17th), the Washington Post features an article on its front page, above the fold, highlighting panic among mothers whose teen daughters may be going to college in a state that has restricted abortion on demand until birth.

What is the best course of action for pro-lifers?

Bishop Burbidge provides this guidance: "Everything we've been doing we have to continue to do with greater intensity" he urged in a recent podcast. He encouraged continued and increased support for crisis pregnancy centers.

As if anticipating the Bishop's appeal, the Knights of Columbus, in its July-August 22 issue of Columbia magazine entitled "Mothers and Children First" quotes Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly announcing the Aid and Support After Pregnancy program. ASAP is a new Orderwide initiative to strengthen K of C assistance for pregnancy resource centers. As a follow up to the new initiative, on August 10, the Knights sent out an e-mail describing the new program.

On the diocesan level, the July 28-August 10, 2022 Arlington Catholic Herald, page 3, features an article on Holy Spirit parish in Annandale and what it is doing to support the goals of ASAP.

It was gratifying to see at our weekly vigil at 5999 Stevenson Avenue on August 13 so many young families with their children praying and saying the rosary. For the abortion center where we pray, it is business as usual but we should not abandon our pro-life efforts when the momentum appears to be on our side, at least legally.

PRAYER FOR LIFE

O Mary, bright dawn of the new world, Mother of the living, to you do we entrust the cause of our life: Look down, O Mother, upon the vast numbers of babies not allowed to be born, of the poor whose lives are made difficult, of men and women who are victims of brutal violence, of the elderly and the sick killed by indifference or out of misguided mercy. Grant that all who believe in your Son may proclaim the Gospel of Life with honesty and love to the people of our time. Obtain for them the grace to accept that Gospel as a gift ever new, the joy of celebrating it with gratitude throughout their lives and the courage to bear witness to it resolutely, in order to build, together with all people of good will, the civilization of

Just thinking . . .

Eternal life in heaven or hell is front and center when it comes to the drama of life. Regardless of denomination, nearly every religion's primary goal is to help living souls prepare for death and what happens then, Bible readers will find nine readings that tell about believers dying and being returned to life. All of these miracles are worth recalling.

Some 900 years before Jesus' birth, Elijah prayed and the Lord restored life to the son of a widow. It was for her that Elijah, in the midst of a drought-caused famine, performed a miracle of keeping her jars full of flour and oil. [1 Kings 17:17-4] Elisha, in the next instance, revives the dead son of an influential mother who sends for him. [2 Kings 4:18-37]

At the time Elisha died, a band of Moabites invaded. Some people were burying an unidentified man. Seeing the raiders, they threw the body into Elisha's grave, and the man came back to life after hitting Elisha's bones. [2 Kings 13:0-21]

In the New Testament, when Jesus and his disciples were nearing the city of Nain they saw a dead man being carried out, accompanied by his widowed mother. Jesus took pity on the woman, touched the coffin and told the young man to arise. And he did. [Luke 7:11-17]

Jairus, a synagogue official, came to Jesus and asked him to heal his 12-year-old daughter at home. By the time they arrived, she had died. Telling the mourners not to weep for the girl who was not dead but sleeping, he went to her side and told her to rise. She began to breathe immediately, and was given food. [Luke 8:40-56]

Mary, the woman who had anointed Jesus' feet and dried them with her hair, and her sister Martha sent for him to come to Bethany because their brother Lazarus was ill. Before Jesus got there, the brother died. The dead man had been in his tomb for four days when Jesus arrived and ordered, "Lazarus, come out"! [John 11:1-44].

The moment Jesus died on the cross, an earthquake rocked the earth, tombs opened up, and many saints who had fallen asleep were raised [Matthew 27:50-53].

Peter, the Apostle, was in Lydda when he was asked to come to nearby Joppa because Tabitha had died. He knelt by her bed and said, "Tabitha, rise up". She opened her eyes, saw Peter, and sat up [Acts 9:36-42].

Paul was in Troas for a few days instructing his followers. He began speaking as the group gathered to break bread, and continued until midnight. A youth named Eutychus was sitting on a window sill listening. He fell asleep, causing his fall of three stories and his death. Paul went to his body and embraced him. Don't be alarmed; there is life in him. Eutychus returned upstairs with him, ate, and listened till Paul stopped talking at daybreak. [Acts 20:7-12]

Death and life are linked in various ways in another nine Old and New Testament stories. Strikingly, Bible readers are not told when and how these eighteen died finally.

Most important to the truths of Christianity is Jesus' resurrection. That elemental fact to the faith is recounted at the beginnings of the books by Evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

Jesus ascended to heaven. In his beneficence, however, he remains in reality on the altars of Catholic churches and chapels around the world and in the hearts and bodies of those receiving him in Holy Communion.

Had all that not happened, the gates to Paradise, closed by original sin, would have remained shut. But they are unlocked for those following the Way.

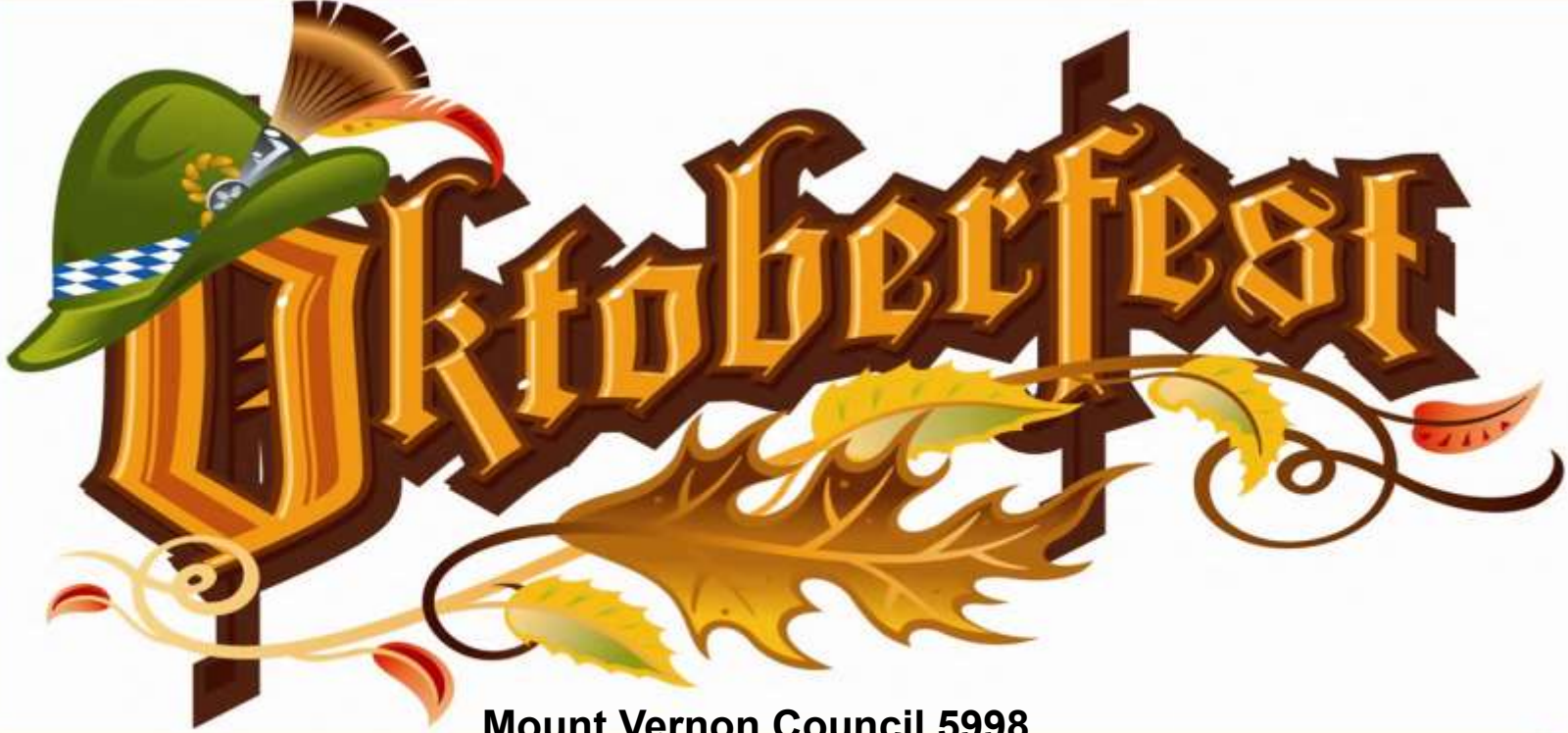
