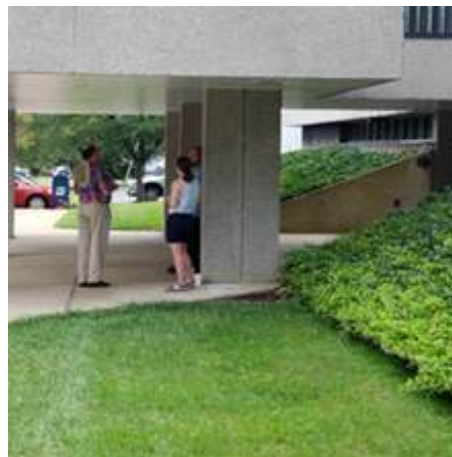

The pious would be on their knees.

We can calculate the date of every Easter – past or future – because it will fall on the first Sunday after the first full moon after March 21. And astronomy can date every full moon.

Knowing nothing of the future is a blessing. Oh, we know death is inevitable. No one has ever escaped, save for the Savior.

"A loud voice came out of the temple from the throne, saying, 'It is done.'" [Rev. 16:17] That will announce the end of the world.

My mother would say a prayer for safety as the family began a car trip, short or long. We would exchange kisses. Never know, do we? The Boy Scouts' slogan says it all.

Catholics have that in mind when praying for a happy death. They want to be in a state of grace. But, most of all, they wish to be blessed for the trip to eternity fortified with Viaticum.

That reception of Communion as part of Extreme Unction refers to the ancient Greek custom of providing a meal before leaving on a journey. The Latin term is viaticus.

A safe bet is that this and many more generations won't need to worry about time ending. Nonetheless, God knows the exact time the world will end.

Meanwhile, preparation for undergoing individual judgment is the vocation of every Christian.
