

FROM OUR CHAPLAIN FR. THOMAS FERGUSON

NEW SAINTS: SIGNS OF HOPE FOR OUR CHURCH AND OUR WORLD

On Sunday, September 7, 2025, Pope Leo XIV will canonize two saints: Carlo Acutis (1991-2006) and Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-1925).

Saint Carlo Acutis has been described as the first "millennial" saint. Very much a saint of our times, he used digital media to promote Catholic devotion, designing at a very young age a website that documented Eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions.

Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati was a person whose family enjoyed material prosperity which he himself used to assist those who were poor and who struggled to meet their families' basic material needs.

Both saints had a great personal devotion to the Eucharist and manifested the fruit of the Holy Spirit in their lives in the joy they took in sharing God's love with others, especially family and friends, and in their love for the beauty of God's creation.

During this Jubilee Year, let us pray that the holy lives of Saint Carlo and Saint Pier Giorgio may be a sign of hope for all, a sign that sanctity and sainthood are possible even in the midst of our world today.

THE MCGIVNEY PRAYER

God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor. Through the example of his life and virtue may we follow your Son, Jesus Christ, more closely, fulfilling his commandment of charity and building up his Body which is the Church. Let the inspiration of your servant prompt us to greater confidence in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast. We humbly ask that you glorify your venerable servant Father Michael J. McGivney on earth according to the design of your holy will. Through his intercession, grant the favor I now present (here make your request). Through Christ our Lord. Amen.







Standing Firm in Truth and Faith: The Duty of Catholic Men in an Age of Moral Decay and Confusion

In an age where moral ambiguity is celebrated and truth is often reduced to personal preference, the Holy Roman Catholic Church remains a beacon of clarity and conviction. Faithful Catholic men, especially those who have pledged themselves to the mission of the Knights of Columbus, are called to be spiritual leaders in their homes, parishes, and communities, standing firm in the defense of truth, even when it is unpopular. This calling is not merely a suggestion; it is a sacred obligation rooted in love, fidelity, and courage.

The Catholic Church understands that affirming and institutionalizing behavior contrary to Divine Law can lead a society away from truth and justice. Sin is not merely a private matter; it affects the soul of a culture. When grave sin becomes normalized, celebrated, or institutionalized, it distorts the moral compass of future generations. The Catechism of the Catholic Church, Sacred Scripture, and the teachings of the Order all affirm that Catholic Knights must stand unashamed and resolute against the cultural tide that seeks to normalize grave moral evils. Among these are gender transition, homosexual acts, and abortion, each a direct assault on God's Natural Law and Divine Truth.

Before addressing these evils, we must first understand what truth is. The Truth is not subjective. It is not "your truth" or "my truth", as some suggest. These are merely shades of wrong. The Truth is God's Truth—unchanging, eternal, and wholly right. As Catholic men, our mission is to lead souls toward Truth. The more Truth we know, the closer we draw to God, for God is Truth itself.

For the sake of brevity, I will be discussing only two of these evils in this article. Let's begin with gender transition. Gender transition is a rejection of God's Divine Design. Genesis 1:27 offers a foundational declaration of human nature. It declares, "Male and female He created them." This is not a social construct; it is a sacred reality. Human beings are created male or female by God, and this is not a disorder but a divine design. CCC 2333 teaches that "Everyone, man and woman, should acknowledge and accept his sexual identity." To affirm someone's desire to reject their God-given sex is not charitable or loving; it is confusion and disorder. True charity encourages individuals to live in harmony with the unity of body and soul that God created.

It is important to note that medical interventions aimed at gender reassignment (hormone therapies and surgeries) carry serious risks such as sterility, cardiovascular disease, chronic pain, and psychological distress. These procedures cannot change the genetic sex encoded in every cell of the human body. More importantly, they disrupt the sacred integrity of the person. Authentic healing comes not from reshaping the body, but from restoring harmony with one's created nature.

The Church does not reject those who struggle with gender dysphoria. CCC 2358 calls us to treat all persons with "respect, compassion, and sensitivity." However, respect does not mean affirming untruths. Catholic men



must defend truth with clarity and love, helping others seek peace through truth, not emotion. I reiterate, affirming something that is not true is not love. Father McGivney, steeped in Catholic anthropology, would have affirmed each person's God-given identity and offered compassionate guidance to those struggling with gender dysphoria, never encouraging alteration of the body, but always upholding the Truth with mercy.

Let's now turn to the issue of homosexual acts. The Church teaches that persons with the mental illness of same-sex attraction must be treated with dignity and compassion as well. However, CCC 2357 is unequivocal: "Homosexual acts are intrinsically disordered. They are contrary to the natural law." Romans 1:26-27 describes same-sex acts as contrary to nature and turning away from God's design, and 1 Corinthians 6:9-10 affirms this teaching, warning that unrepentant sin separates one from the kingdom of God. This sin is forgiven only through true repentance.

Blessed Father McGivney believed that families, rooted in the sacrament of marriage between a man and a woman, were the cornerstone of society. Understand that Knightly charity speaks hard truths. To accept homosexual acts as morally acceptable is to betray Divine Law. Knights and their families should avoid any parish that flies the pride flag, a symbol that celebrates sin. Pride in sexual sin is a deadly sin and a rebellion against God. CCC 2359 calls homosexual persons to chastity, a path of sanctity and peace. The Church's teaching is not rejection; it is a call to live in accordance with God's moral law, which promotes human wellbeing. As a parish priest, Father McGivney ministered with love to all, but he understood that sexual expression is ordered toward marriage and procreation. Homosexual acts are inconsistent with God's plan.


What is the role of the Knight in standing up to the transgender and homosexual lobby? The first principle of the Knights of Columbus is charity. But charity is not passive—it is active, courageous, and rooted in truth. Catholic men must be protectors of divine order, defenders of truth, and witnesses to the Gospel. Understand that defending what is "right and just" is not self-righteousness; it is obedience to Christ. Remember, we are not called to comfort; we are called to greatness. As Pope Benedict XVI said, "The world offers you comfort. But you were not made for comfort. You were made for greatness." The Church needs bold Catholic men, not bystanders. Saint Paul exhorts in 1 Corinthians 16:13: "Be watchful, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong." When truth is under attack, silence can be complicit. The Catechism also warns against "cowardice and compromise", calling each Catholic to live in moral courage.

To stand against the homosexual lobby and gender ideology is not hatred; it is fidelity. It is love in its highest form, love that seeks the good of the other, even when the truth is hard. The Church does not shame, it sanctifies. Catholic Knights must be its boldest witnesses. Standing firm in love and truth helps individuals seek authentic healing and peace.

Father McGivney's vision lives on in the Knights of Columbus' unwavering commitment to pro-life advocacy, family support, and the public defense of Catholic teaching. In honoring his legacy, Catholic men today are called to be courageous witnesses to truth, just as he was. Let us rise, Brother Knights, with courage and conviction. Let us defend Truth, defend the sanctity of marriage, protect life by respecting the sanctity of life in the womb, and uphold the dignity of every person as created by God. In doing so, we fulfill our sacred duty, not just as Knights, but as men of God to proclaim the truth with clarity and strength, even when society calls good evil and evil good.

JUST THINKING... CARL EIFERT AI NOT NECESSARILY A-1

Artificial intelligence is all the rage, especially in the field of robotics. Although these machines – computers – fall far short of human thought, they perform many practical tasks, from medical diagnosis to chatbots.

For the uninitiated, like this writer, a chatbot is defined as a computer program that uses AI and natural language processing to understand questions, then automate responses that simulate human conversation.

They are said to "reason" to such an extent as to prove mathematical formulas and to play chess. They even may be capable of handling moral questions if programmed correctly. To reason is to think in logical and sensible ways.

Pope Francis wrote in 2018: "Artificial intelligence, robotics and other technological innovations must be so employed that they contribute to the service of humanity and to the protection of our common home, rather than to the contrary, as some assessments unfortunately foresee."

"Al can destroy humanity and the world if it won't let itself be switched off." That fear has been heard.

But a counter version could be developed in a fight for survival..

"Our AI can beat your AI. So there!"

Perhaps some kind of morality may have taken hold so that no nuclear bomb has been detonated since Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

Nonetheless, some fear that AI could somehow go rogue and destroy the world. Or would it take some mad scientist or sadistic dictator to trigger that horror? Perhaps that fear should grab attention in the town square.

A few sects have been known to let all daily tasks slip while they awaited a doomsday that did not arrive — William Miller in 1844, Jim Jones in 1978, David Koresh in 1993, and lesser known others..

Someday the cataclysm will occur. The Church teaches that a Last Judgment will come to humankind.

But the Church is more intent on teaching Catholics to live good lives and praising God. In His goodness, Jesus gave the Apostles and their priest successors the power to forgive sins in His place.

Meanwhile, it is good to contemplate natural human intelligence. It is what sets us apart from the insentient worm (that can live as two after being cut in half) or the elephant, renowned for memory.

Intelligence is linked with free will. Adam and Eve used theirs to enjoy the forbidden fruit. Now, eons later, our free will lets us choose the forbidden or embrace the holy. That embrace is needed to be given eternal happiness.

While still on earth, we Catholics have the actual presence of Jesus Himself in the Eucharist. No wonder it is also called Holy Communion. Jesus comes to us as real food as well as spiritual sustenance and becomes part of us.

Blessed Alexandrina da Costa (1904-55) consumed only Sacred Hosts for the last 13 years of her life.

Her ability to live without ordinary food defies reason.

Does artificial intelligence account for faith in God? Apparently, no. Faith, like hope and love, is immaterial, incorporeal, and spiritual. These are God's gifts.
