# NEW SAINTS: SIGNS OF HOPE FOR OUR CHURCH AND OUR WORLD

On Sunday, September 7, 2025, Pope Leo XIV will canonize two saints: Carlo Acutis (1991-2006) and Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-1925).

Saint Carlo Acutis has been described as the first "millennial" saint. Very much a saint of our times, he used digital media to promote Catholic devotion, designing at a very young age a website that documented Eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions.

Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati was a person whose family enjoyed material prosperity which he himself used to assist those who were poor and who struggled to meet their families' basic material needs.

Both saints had a great personal devotion to the Eucharist and manifested the fruit of the Holy Spirit in their lives in the joy they took in sharing God's love with others, especially family and friends, and in their love for the beauty of God's creation.

During this Jubilee Year, let us pray that the holy lives of Saint Carlo and Saint Pier Giorgio may be a sign of hope for all, a sign that sanctity and sainthood are possible even in the midst of our world today.

God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor. Through the example of his life and virtue may we follow your Son, Jesus Christ, more closely, fulfilling his commandment of charity and building up his Body which is the Church. Let the inspiration of your servant prompt us to greater confidence in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast. We humbly ask that you glorify your venerable servant Father Michael J. McGivney on earth according to the design of your holy will. Through his intercession, grant the favor I now present (here make your request). Through Christ our Lord. Amen.


## **PRO-LIFE CORNER**

# JUST THINKING... CARL EIFERT CHRISTIAN CIVILITY

In less than a quarter century, America will become a nation populated by a majority practicing no religion. Christians will be a minority by 2045, according to a Pew Research poll.

Not many decades ago, the last Mass on Sundays was packed, worshippers standing in the aisles.

Look around now, and the pews are half-full at best. True, the population has grown, and those forgoing worship have also increased proportionally. Statistics gathered by the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate contrast the differences over a half-century — between 1970 and 2021.

- Official Catholic Directory: 47.9 million members then and 66.8 million now
- Self-identified Catholics: 54.1m and 73.2m
- Converts: 2.9m and 4.4m

Those reared Catholic who say they are no longer Catholic: 3.5m and 30.8m

Pew says defecting Christians are becoming atheists, agnostics, and nihilists. Presumably, those leaving the Church – now some eight times more than a half-century ago – are doing likewise.

Are these "bad" people? Probably not. Sin could be somewhat more frequent among secularists than Catholics and Protestants; most people don't stray beyond societal boundaries. Rather, if they left Catholicism, they might convince themselves they do not have to visit the confessional anymore.

Those leaving other religions might relish sleeping late on Sundays. These strays must still feel the pangs of conscience, if ever so weak.

Churchgoers know it is right to worship the God who made them. Practicing Catholics know they have the Sacraments, particularly Reconciliation and the Eucharist, to cherish.

American/ Western culture has turned its back on the time when society was modified by the adjective "polite." Back then, one might murmur "thanks" and "you're welcome" while holding the door for a lady, still the courtesies were made. The value of good manners was recognized. Now sports, and even work clothes replace our "Sunday best" for church.

What attributes to the current coarseness of society?

Speculate or research why, the fact is that the formalities of polite society are rarely seen these days. Youth forswears "mister" and "missus" for first names. Fist-bumps replace firm handshakes. "After you" isn't uttered by the guy rushing ahead of his date.

Being religious, if only on the surface, helped most people achieve certain civility. That showed respect for others. Even the well-recognized "me generation" is becoming a more selfish one. This degeneration will probably reverse before caveman behavior returns. That reversal can't come too soon.

Being truly religious can bring inner peace and the strength to live in the world.



According to tradition, Our Lady gave the scapular as a sign of salvation to Saint Simon Stock, a Carmelite priest, in 1251. She promised that "Those who die wearing this scapular shall not suffer eternal fire."
